Bishop Dwayne C. Debnam, Pastor Morning Star Baptist Church

Faith, Integrity, Character and Commitment serve as guiding principles for the life and ministry of Bishop Dwayne C. Debnam, the Senior Pastor of the Morning Star Baptist Church in Woodlawn, Maryland. Bishop Debnam was called to serve Morning Star in August 1996.
